Commentary on P&L

- Legal expenses for TRR incorporation should be substantially concluded in 2018
- Sculling and sweep program participation increased
- Rack fees increased \$50
- Large Maintenance increase due to boat damage
- Equipment Rentals for launch and sweep boats from UML were lower than expected
 - In the fall, boat sharing of pairs eliminated sweep boat rentals
- Strong cash position \$111,452


Festival Regatta

- Dottie Semonian, Regatta Director
- 170 entries (226 entries 2017), 28 clubs
- Profitable at \$3,587
- Recommend June 23, 2019 for Festival

- Considering going to 1K for all races in 2019 to increase race slots and still finish by 3pm
- Consider capping at 200 entries (unless all are 1K)
 Thank you to LRRA for loaning supplies at no charge

TRR'18 Highlights





TRR Committee: Carl P, Peg L, John B Karen S, Dottie S, LRRA

- 533 entries, 70 clubs... Down from 571 and 75 in 2017
- TRR is financially sound, but has significant contingency risks.
- New rev source \$2000 from Sponsors, and \$1875 from 22 Team Tents
- 2019 will be 40th Anniversary TRR
- Regatta-Day Analysis looking for TRR Intern for special project

TRR 2018 – Estimate Profit

- 14
- Still waiting for invoices this is the major reason for the delay in settling the books
- □ Revenue \$65,000 for 2018 and \$65,106 for 2017.
- Fewer registrations conflict with Worlds in FL but sponsors were a new addition
- Expenses (before distributions) \$49,000 for 2018 (estimate) and \$48,000 for 2017
- □ So more or less same expenses (higher medical)
- Overall Profit from regatta is approximately
 \$16,000 for each of past two years

 Scullers for the remainder of the season.
- This year we trialed having a Double Class (3 hours on one Saturday). Participants seemed to enjoy going for a longer row "up past the bridge".
- In December 2018
 LTSCULL will do something similar next season.

MRRA Open Sweep 2018

- Mike Carenza-Sholz, program manager
- This was the first year of the program after a several year hiatus and after some bumps along the way was an overall success!
- □ We ended up with 24 total members; 14 men and 10 women.
- We had good representation of the program at TRR and Cromwell Cup, and even had enough to bring a trailer of boats to both Narragansett Sweeps and Sculls and Methuen City Sprints.
- Special thanks to Mark Lewis for coaching the program!

Equipment Committee

Base Assumptions for Equipment for 2018

- 1. Board allocated up to \$12K for equipment purchases for 2018
 - No boats were purchased \$6500 deferred to following year
- 2. Base assumptions
 - No additional space inside or outside boathouse
 - Accomac 4X will go on trailer outside
- 3. Rental fee for one UML launch any day is \$2,500 through 31 Aug
 - No charge for UML launch Fall 2018 due to boat sharing
- 4. Sweep boat rental rate from UML was \$2,000 through 31 Aug
 - two Eights and two Fours

- No charge for Sweep boats from UML in Fall 2018 due to boat sharing


MRRA LOGBOOK STATS 2018






- 2018 was +3.6% over 2017 on rower-hours

- More 8+ and 4x rowing than 2017




- Top 30 rowers all had 50+ hours on the water

- Andy Raitto wins Most Hours on the Water 2018!





Approval of Base Membership


- Increase Base Membership to \$175 for 2019

- Student rate of \$100 membership and \$175 off-peak logbook sculling/sweep in a program
- Rationale
 - Base Membership defines voting rights
 - Club has cash flow needs before rowing season starts for insurance, boathouse user fees
 - High % of members paid by 15 January 2018
