The club owns a couple PFD's. Safety Recommends individuals purchase this piece of equipment.

Water temperature is 46 degrees today

Rowing restrictions on MRRA Web site, will be updated regularly by the Boat Captain. At this time Big Boats only

Recommend to carry PFD and a cell phone on board Safety prefers to have individuals wear PFD, Inflatables, and recommends you check CO2 cartridge each season.

Or Cabbalas hunting supply for about \$69.

At this time:

Water flow rate is high, need to look for debris, Safety Wires are not in place above the falls So rowing is not permitted below the boathouse.

May cap some events, using last years TRR events data.

Think revenue for TRR will be the same this year, if goes to two days TRR in year 2 and 3 would be more income

Income comes from Revenue for entries, about 50% of revenue comes form parking, team tents and vender tents.
