## **Equipment Committee:**

Met on Saturday and plans to meet again on Wednesday Will make suggestions for equipment purchases for 2014, finalizing budget

#### Launches:

Peter Murray trying to put boat house user group meeting together Can we have a common launch and maintenance group? Expect discussion about adding a Wake-less launch How would this happen, would need details, serious discussion for next year planned.

# **Equipment committee:**

Karen Scammell was present: Met last Saturday, intends to meet again this Wednesday

Daniel Ernst volunteering to chair under the guidance of Bob Bowen

Possible sale of Fluid 1x, and the Hudson 1X

Last season the Fluid 1X damaged, expensive to fix, Did the Hudson get rowed enough Light weight women limited to Px 25 or Hudson, would need replacement

Would all better A boats be replaced by recreational hulls?

Bob Sengstaken- suggests that club continue to offer racing shells in the fleet, not replace all hulls with recreational shells, should maintain variety for racing and advanced scullers

Discussion about replacing Vespoli 2x/ 2-

### **Equipment budget:**

MRRA will receive 13 K from TRR
The TRR will purchase docks with the other proceeds
This will allow expansion to launch sites up river for 2014
Could also use \$5000 from the Festival Regatta, giving 18K for the budget.

#### Programs:

Jason Holden: Chairman Very few changes from 2013 No Junior Programs- Back to UML
Open Sweep will have fewer sessions this year
Learn to Scull Programs: need Coach

One Coaching Candidate: Will set up interview

Continue to advertise and spread word we are looking

#### **Learn to Sweep:**

Karen brought information from her discussion with Jody DeCarolis and Barbara Sherman, trying to increase Learn to Sweep participation. Have felt cost has limited interest, discussed lowering the price, shorter sessions 4 weeks (\$100) reduced from \$300, discussion about whether lowering cost for sweep would take individuals from learn to scull, is there a way to have both about the same fee? Would offering a Saturday AM program for 4 weeks attract new interest?

### **Open Sweep:**

Women will come back this season, small group

Katie Courtamache will set up to lead, probably 4 individuals- would cover cost of boat rental from UML

Open Sweep Men- expect 8

Budget for off peak sculling, 6 of the 8 open men will plan to also be logbook scullers

# Costs and Fees of Programs: unchanged for 2013

Rack Fees: User fee is \$4500 for space and \$9000 membership

\$350, temporary rack gets paid to UML

Logbook Sculling \$250

Restricted logbook After hours, no reserving, no racing \$100

Racing Associate: membership is \$100

Out door rack \$150 for temporary if available

Family Membership \$100

Membership fee \$125 has been determined by the insurance. Has been covering the cost, Bronwyn Chapman and Karen Scammell will review the costs and determine if this continues to be the case, or if membership fees need to increased in 2015.

**Discussion about Racks**, members who pay membership and rack only don't pay into the club equipment, Get an excellent value.

Plan is to update the rack policy: a group has volunteered to meet and review Last year several rack holders did not complete the mandatory number of rows Would these members consider moving boats out? Allowing a MRRA buddy to row there scull?

If not going to row the mandatory number in a season should there be a surcharge (boat penalty for not following the policy.) Some significant dollar amount added to \$350 if the scull is not rowed. Would this get individuals to think about moving boats out to allow other MRRA members an opportunity to have a rack space?

May deter members who are paying \$350 and storing the scull, intent was always for these boats to be actively used.

Other individuals would join if rack space was available

The BOD appreciates that some of the MRRA Rack holders are heavily involved in the club and volunteer extensively. The BOD does not want to be unfair to individuals that may not be rowing because they are keeping other commitments to the club. Dennis McCarthy agrees to join the Rack Policy

Reviewed the US Rowing Contract: Briefly reviewed the Copy Core MRRA Members have agreed to volunteering for this and the Festival Regatta Will meet next month.
