# Proposed New Towe Rack

## The Time Has Come ...

- The good high quality summer river scum has arrived
- The towel rack is broken and leaning against the oars to avoid falling over
- The area has the usual clutter of:
  - The rack itself
  - Towels falling off the rack onto the floor
  - Clothes basket for clean towels
  - Clothes basket for dirty towels
  - Dirty towel transport mesh bag
  - ... and the sweet smell of whatever lives in the damp towels
- We need a new/better system



#### Suggested New Rack Requirements

- Wheels for easy movement/oar access
- Greater hanging towel capacity
- Easier placement of towels on rack
- Eliminate/reduce towel overlapping quicker drying
- Keep any towel that falls off a hanger from falling onto the floor
- Incorporate rack, dirty towel basket and clean towel basket into a single rack with smaller total footprint
- Make rack unit & towel hanger positions adjustable to support any changes needed

#### Proposal


- Towel hangers
  - I have a piece of pegboard cluttering my cellar -> good panel to support movable towel hangers on 1 inch grid.
  - Towel hangers can be put on both sides (front and back) of pegboard
  - Use longer (12") towel hangers which accommodate most towels wells. Preferably use loop hangers to separate sides of each hanging towel for better drying
- Purchase and mount above in an adjustable rolling 3 shelf wire rack w/wheels
  - Adjustable shelf height
  - Adjustable rack footprint (requires different shelves)
  - Dimension rack to support both baskets for clean and dirty towels. Baskets are approximately 18.5"W x 27.5"L x 12"H
  - Decided to err on the larger side and go with 24"W x 36"L
    - 24"W x 30"L, 21"W x 30"L are other options that rack can be modified to that support requirements (with less hanging space) if this is a little too big
  - Chose a rack height of 60" off floor –compromise between maximizing towel space without making top basket too high (~70").
    - This can be shorter with different posts if it proves too high

## **Proposed Design**

- 24"x 36"x 60" rack shown
- 12" (300mm) loop end towel hangers on front and back of rack:

 Removable "locking" mechanism to prevent accidental towel hanger dislocation if bumped

- •Towel hanger positions adjustable on 1" grid
- Different sizes (flootprint and height) possible if this needs optimization



#### Cost

- It's a little pricey compared to a cheap clothes rack hopefully more organized, better utility
- Estimated total cost is ~ \$270, allocated as follows:
